Wilkeson Elementary Construction

Renovation and new construction at Wilkeson Elementary has begun! The remodel will consist of updating mechanical, plumbing and the interior of the historical building. A new addition is being built to accommodate a new kitchen, multipurpose room, library, three new classrooms and an administrative area. The project will also encompass a new main entry with improved security and convenience. Lincoln Construction was selected for the Wilkeson project. The firm has extensive experience with renovating historic buildings and new construction. Contractors have been on site and removed the playground equipment, installed fencing for construction and for erosion control as well. In the coming weeks, the portables at Wilkeson will be moved to Elk Ridge Elementary and Glacier Middle School. The portables moved to Elk Ridge will be used for temporary classrooms during their construction project. The portable that is going to Glacier will be used for temporarily storage on the Middle School campus. After Thanksgiving weekend, demolition on the gym building will begin, and the interior of the main building will be prepped for renovation.
